On Mondays and Wednesdays, a team of about 10 volunteers gather in the BVCC downstairs kitchen to prepare lunches for up to 100 children in our community, who would otherwise go without this meal. The volunteers include Gay Starozik and Jean Ramsay from our church family.

The lunches they prepare can include sandwiches, fruit, veggies, cookies or other treats and sometimes yogurt. Each day that the volunteers come in, they prepare 2 days of lunches. Their task also includes kitchen clean up and sanitizing and delivering the lunches to the participating schools.

We are one of several Brown Bagging locations in the city, striving to provide nutritious lunches for the $2 \%$ of the school age children in Calgary (approximately 5000) who are living in situations of food insecurity. The Pandemic proved very challenging for this program, as it adapted to children being at home. Brown Bagging shifted to Grab and Go lunches provided in specific locations and grocery cards for eligible children. Hopefully, this fall, the school season will see a return to regular lunch preparation.
