as the Global Missions Director. We asked her to share her heart for missions. "For we have this treasure in jars of clay" (2 Cor 4:7).



This is a word picture that captures the "why" of missions. Missions is about sharing the treasure (God's story of love, redemption and reconciliation) through jars of clay (the lives of willing and obedient Christ followers who want others to personally experience God's love and faithfulness). The treasure is shared in the work of Bible translation, English language ministries, social justice, Christian higher education, camping ministries, church planting and leadership development.

(The BVCC family) is financially generous and faithful - many of our supported missions could not do the work God has given them if we did not provide finances. People desire to pray - that may be a positive of the last 18 months. We are more willing, determined, intentional about being people who pray. We are gradually relinquishing our independent mindset and learning to surrender our desire to be in control.

I love to listen and encourage people to recognize and develop the gifts God gave them and then to do the good work that is theirs to do. My desire is to help the Missions team imagine new possibilities for how Bow Valley, both as a community and individually, might share God's love with the rest of the world.
